7 Decisions

7.1 Fuel Jetty

Meeting on 22nd May is an information evening for members to advise them of the current situation, plans for refurbishment & funding options. Drawings will assist the Club in seeking funding for the refurbishment project.

Request for \$4,500 + GST for structural drawings for fuel jetty replacement from the major maintenance budget. Drawings will assist the Club in seeking funding for the refurbishment project.

Concern expressed that other options are not being considered. A bare minimum option would be to have a fuelling pontoon with services on piles & a service walkway. But a minimal jetty may not supply the facilities the Club members require.

The Club's major maintenance fund has sufficient to fund the drawings. Funding for the replacement will be partly via Club funds & other alternative funding will also be sought.

Resolution:

A budget of \$4,500 + GST for structural drawings for fuel jetty replacement be approved from the major maintenance funds. Commissioning of the drawings will be conditional on general support from the Club member information evening 22 May 2024 & a budget price on a "like for like" replacement.

Resolution:

On review of the fuel jetty condition report & after discussion with Haigh Workman it is resolved that gates x 2 be installed on the fuel jetty to ensure controlled access. An access key will be available for purchase to allow access to the jetty on condition of accepting & signing a liability waiver & reviewing the jetty hazard register. On purchase of a key, fuelling will still be possible from the floating pontoon & bowser platform. A budget of up to \$2,500 + GST is requested for this

installation.

M Tuner & T Bingham met with MP G McCallum & discussed funding assistance for fuel jetty replacement & environmental cleanup of the historical grid as well as requesting his help with progressing the reclamation title application with LINZ. An information meeting for Club members is being held in the clubhouse 6pm Wednesday 22nd May.

G McCallum has communicated to the LINZ minister, MP C Pink, to try & push the application on.

8.3 Haul Out

The member has now withdrawn this motion/request as a result of communication with him. Here for information only.

"Motion put by Derry Godbert, Seconded by Kit Staff.

Request that the General Committee seriously consider the need for a Special General meeting or equivalent communication channel to consult with and inform the KCC members of the reasons for the verbal closure of our very valuable Haul Out Facility" "Discussion;

- 1, This Haul Out is a very important asset to the club, financially, conveniently, for safety, and as part of our responsibility.
- 2, My booking for the weekend of 12th. to 14th. April was suddenly terminated on Tuesday 9th. causing me 100s of \$s worth of cost and major inconvenience. No reason was given for the emergency which caused this. No reflection on the club Admin staff who took the trouble to inform me as soon as possible.
- 3, The one benefit was that being forced to use the Opua Haul Out I am able to make a direct comparison with the Far North Holding facility and our own. Suffice to say that the system at Opua is much more expensive and less convenient in many ways than our own. The staff there were very pleasant but the facilities not nearly so user friendly. The travel lift in particular for those who understand them.
- 4, I feel that the club members must have a clear explanation of why a very important club asset should be destroyed without any consultation.

NB: information has been included in the Club's notices as to why the haul out facility has been closed. Work is underway to allow the reopening of the facility & more communications with members will follow. D Godbert has been advised that the closure is not intended to be permanent.

9 Decision Report

9.1 Expediting Pile Replacement/Refurbishment

Authorisation is sought for the KCC Marina Committee & Club Officers to review & approve the request for tender documents & resulting tenders for marina & Club piling replacement work.

Background: there are only two realistic contractors available for Club piling work. These are Total Marine Services (TMS) & Hallet Enterprises. Other marine contractors are either not considered suitable for a variety of reasons or are based further afield & unlikely (based on experience) to tender for this relatively small contract.

Both TMS & Hallets have gaps in their schedules before the end of 2024 that the Club could fit in with. If the Club is unable to take advantage of those calendar openings, the piling will most likely not be scheduled until at least March if not later in 2025.

Resolution: That:

- Total Marine Services & Hallet Enterprises be accepted as pre-qualified contractors for piling contracts,
- As Hallets have availability in the short term, work to secure their services in June 2024 to undertake the piling plan to the extent that they can secure materials up to the 28 pile 2023 plan.
- Based on Hallets performance for this year's plan the Club can then enter a competitive tendering process between TMS and Wilkes/Hallet to make 2025 and 2026 booking slots to ensure we secure services for a 30-40 pile replacement programme.
