1.0 Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* 2009-2012.
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part II, Category 5 shall apply to keel yachts and multihulls.
- 1.3 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part V, Category C shall apply for trailer yachts.
- 1.4 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part VI, Category B shall apply for sportboats.
- 1.5 The Elliott 5.9 Association Class Rules shall apply.
- 1.6 The Flying 15 Association Class Rules shall apply.
- 1.7 The required safety gear must be carried on board at all times and may be inspected.

2.0 Rating System

- 2.1 The Club Rum Race Handicap is to be used for this series.

3.0 Changes to the Racing Rules

The Rules will be modified in accordance with Rule 86 as follows:-

- 3.1 For any protests where only a rule of Part 2 is alleged to have been broken, an arbitration hearing will be offered prior to any formal hearing. YNZ regulations part 4.5.5 applies.
- 3.2 Rule 44.1 is changed so that the 720° turn is replaced by a 360° turn.
- 3.3 Rule 51 & 52 is modified to allow nominated boats i.e. [A Canting Keel], [Water Ballast Tanks] with movable Ballast to compete. Boats must comply with ISAF Appendix K [www.sailing.org] and Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations clause 6 [www.yachtingnz.org.nz]. TCF'S may be altered accordingly.
- 3.4 Rule 52 "Manual Power" shall not apply.

4.0 Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1 The regatta is open to all: Keelboats, Multihulls, Open Keel Yachts, Sports Boats, Trailer Yachts, Sports Trailer Yachts.
- 4.2 This is a non-spinnaker event. No spinnakers or extras may be set. Extras are defined as sails not normally used to advantage to windward. Headsails may be boomed out using spinnaker booms but shall only be carried on a permanent load bearing forestay with only one sail per forestay.
- 4.3 Series entries will be accepted prior to the first race by completing the entry form accompanied by a fee of \$50 and forwarding it to The Keel Boat Committee, Kerikeri Cruising Club Inc, 346 Opito Bay Road, R D 1, Kerikeri
- 4.4 Individual race entries will be accepted prior to the KCC five minute signal of that entries Division.
- 4.5 Individual race entry is available on the entry sheet in the start box. An entry fee of \$5.00 applies.
- 4.6 Individual race entries will be accepted by VHF or phone (407 9434) prior to the KCC five minute signal of that entries Division.
- 4.7 To be eligible to compete in this event series, the entrant's Helmsperson shall be a full financial member of KCC.

- 4.8 Individual race entries from visiting Yachts will be accepted if the entrant's Helmsperson is a full financial member of an affiliated Yacht Club.
- 4.9 A minimum of 3 yachts entered per division must start to constitute a race. If there are insufficient entries in a division a yacht may choose to sail in another division or withdraw in which case they will receive a refund of the entry fee.

5.0 Racing Schedule:

5.1 The Racing scheduled is as follows

6.0 Re run of races

6.1 The race organisers reserve the right to re-run any postponed or abandoned races. Any rescheduling will be notified on the club website and clubroom notice board not less than 4 days before it will take effect.

7.0 Sailing Instructions

The Sailing Instructions will be made available on the KCC website (www.kerikericruisingclub.org.nz) and in the start box.

8.0 Racing Area

The races will be held in the area of the Bay of Islands.

9.0 Courses to be Sailed

Refer Appendix A of Sailing Instructions.

10.0 Scoring

- 10.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A of the *Racing Rules of Sailing* 2009-2012 will apply.
- 10.2 Seven races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.3 When 7 races or less have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 10.4 When 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 10.5 When 9 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst two scores.
- 10.6 When 10 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst three scores.
- 10.7 When 11 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst four scores.
- 10.8 A yacht disqualified shall not discard that race in any point's series.

11.0 Prizes

- 11.1 Prize giving on each race night will be held no sooner than 1 hour after the last yacht has crossed the finish line.
- 11.2 Visiting Yacht entries are eligible for Race Prizes
- 11.3 Visiting Yacht entries are not eligible for Club Trophies.

11.4 The following prizes shall be awarded:

- **Trophy's for series winner in each division.**
- **Appleton's Rum for 1st place on handicap in each division.**
- **\$40 Drawn Prize vouchers from Craig's investments.**
- **Appleton's Rum drawn prizes – number of draws determined by entry numbers.**
